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# O1 VINCE BAYOU GREENWAY PROPERTY ACQUISITION

### PROPERTY ACQUISITION

Due to narrow site constraints along Vince Bayou, some portions of private property will need to be acquired in order to provide enough room for the proposed trail. The intention of these acquisitions is to acquire only what is needed. An on-street alignment has been shown in the acquisition plans as a alternative in case a property along the route cannot be acquired. The alternative route would consist of a 6' wide sidewalk within the right of way and an adjacent bike lane located within the street. Implementation of this alternative may require relocation of utilities, mail boxes, and other existing obstructions.

Additionally, the trail would cross multiple residential driveways. The alignment along the bayou is the recommended route to provide the best user experience. A final, comprehensive acquisition list will need to be produced once a site survey is completed for the project. Candidate properties for acquisition were determined by several factors listed below.

 Properties overlapping HCFCD easements in narrow top of bank conditions were identified for acquisition to provide adequate room for the proposed trail and associated grading.

- Parcels that extend to the centerline of Vince Bayou were also selected, as they both overlap HCFCD easements and act as a barrier to the trail.
- Properties that provide key connections to parks, roadways, or communities.






